The Japan Foundation is a Japanese public organisation established in 1972 in Tokyo dedicated to promoting cultural and


intellectual exchange between Japan and other nations through the implementation of international cultural exchange

projects. Through its activities, it contributes to the deepening of mutual international understanding and the building of peace in the international community.

It has a global network of 23 offices in 21 countries as well as a Tokyo headquarters, a Kyoto office, two domestic Japaneselanguage institutes in Urawa and Kansai. The Japan Foundation in Australia was founded in 1978 in Canberra and then moved to Sydney in 1988.

The mission of the Japan Foundation is to contribute to the improvement of a good international environment, and to the maintenance and development of harmonious foreign relationships with Japan, by the efficient and comprehensive implementation of activities for international cultural exchange, which will deepen other nations' understanding of Japan, promote better mutual understanding among nations, and contribute to strong relationships in the world.

The Japan Foundation aims to introduce the full spectrum of current Japanese culture and arts around Australia and abroad. This includes a wide range of fields from **daily life and culture to arts such as film, music, and theatre**, showcasing everything from the traditional to the contemporary. The Japan Foundation operates a number of programmes. often in partnership with other organisations.
