This Mobility Funding Guide is a concrete output of the mapping of funding opportunities for international exchange in 19 countries in Asia. It was first released on culture360.org in September 2012 by the Asia-Europe Foundation (ASEF) with the cooperation of Arts Network Asia (ANA), Korea Arts Management Service (KAMS), Japan Center, Pacific Basin Arts Communication (PARC), and Tokyo Performing Arts Market (TPAM).

Its main objectives are to make available online the existing information on funding that supports the international mobility of artists and cultural operators in Asia and to provide input to funders on how to fill in the existing funding gaps for international cultural exchange in Asia.

The guide follows the existing model of the Guide to funding opportunities for the international mobility of artists and culture professionals in Europei, produced by the Foundation Interarts, On the Move and PRACTICS.

In this Asian edition, you can find funding opportunities by country in most artistic and cultural disciplines. The guide lists national resources when available, as well as regional and international sources of funding - be they public or private. Only regular opportunities accessible online are listed. Not included are: funds for which information is only available offline, funds that are not based on open calls, and ad hoc or short-term funding.

For a full overview of the methodology and scope of the research, please refer to the publication's General Introductionⁱⁱ.

This guide is an attempt to gather all the resources in one document and is by no means complete. As we aim to update it on a regular basis through further research and input from the field, your feedback is crucial.

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NATIONAL SOURCES OF FUNDING

1. GOVERNMENTAL FUNDING

1.1 National Arts Council Singapore

Grants and Schemes: Market and Audience Development

Description: This grant supports activities to build audiences, patrons and supporters to complement artistic efforts both in Singapore and abroad. Besides the efforts of arts practitioners the Council recognises that arts intermediaries, such as galleries, presenters, impresarios, literary publishers etc., also play a role in bringing artists and artworks to audiences and markets. This grant supports such efforts that directly benefit Singapore artists, particularly in reaching new audiences and markets. **Type of mobility:** Events participation grants; "go and see" or short-term exploration grants; market development grants; support for the participation of professionals in transnational networks; touring incentives for groups

Sector: Visual arts, performing arts, multi-disciplinary arts, literature

Eligibility criteria

Nationality: Singaporean or permanent residents

Profession: Individuals and organisations (including not for profit and for profit)

Other: Grant open for applications six times a year

Destination: International (Singapore for international guests)

Other priorities: Application round six times a year. NAC also supports a Singaporean residency, Art

Incubator which functions as a transnational network for residencies.

Grant coverage: Depends on the nature of the organisation (profit or not for profit). Maximum of SG\$

70,000. Maximum of three travel grants a year.

1.1 National Arts Council Singapore

International Artist Residency Programme

Description: The International Residency programmes are part of the National Arts Council's on-going efforts to develop the capability of Singapore arts practitioners through their participation in relevant and established international residency platforms as well as to open up opportunities to nurture Singapore talents, address skills gaps in the current arts industry and facilitate subsequent knowledge transfer to benefit the Singapore arts community. The platforms also enable networking opportunities with international counterparts and provide Singapore artists with first-hand insights of the international arts world.

Type of mobility: Artists/writers in residencies

Sectors: Theatre, visual arts, literature

Eligibility criteria

Nationality: Singaporean or permanent residents

Profession: Artists/art practitioners

Destination: International

Other priorities: For the visual arts: Dena Foundation, Paris; Kunstlerhaus Bethanien Germany; for the theatre: La Mama Umbria International Residencies (three programmes), Ecole Philippe Gauthier and Suzuki Company of Toga Summer Training Programme; for the literary arts: Toji Cultural Centre Residency and IOWA International Writing Programme. Deadlines and conditions apply according to the residency schemes.

Grant coverage: Depends on the grants but travel and accommodation are always covered.

1.2 National Heritage Board

Scholarship Scheme

Description: The National Heritage Board (NHB) scholarship scheme provides financial assistance for promising talents in Singapore to pursue full-time undergraduate or postgraduate's studies in the fields of heritage and museum management or administration. The grant is awarded only once for the duration of the study and is non-renewable. Some of the areas of study allowed under the Scheme are: conservation, museum education, curatorial studies, general museum studies, art history, museum exhibition design, heritage studies, and archival studies.

Type of mobility: Scholarships/postgraduate training courses **Sectors:** Cultural heritage, art history, cultural management

Eligibility criteria

Nationality: Singaporean or permanent residents

Profession: NA, but applicant's academic records and participation in extra-curricular activities will be

taken into consideration among others

Other: Employees of the NHB are not allowed to apply.

Destination: International

Other priorities: Upon successful completion of studies, the NHB scholar will be in the employment of

NHB serving a three-year bond on a full-time basis.

Grant coverage: The grant covers 100% of study costs and is capped at a maximum of SG\$100,000.

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1.3 Media Development Authority

Marketing Assistance

Description: The Media Development Authority (MDA) was formed on 1 January 2003 by the merger of the Singapore Broadcasting Authority, the Films and Publications Department and the Singapore Film Commission. This merger aimed to foster the development of a vibrant media sector in Singapore, nurture home-grown media enterprises, attract foreign direct investment and new jobs and encourage greater economic dynamism. *Marketing Assistance* aims to boost overseas demand for Singapore-produced content and to promote Singapore content produced from a range of Singapore media companies in targeted markets.

Type of mobility: Event participation grants, market development grants

Sector: Cinema

Eligibility criteria

Nationality: Singaporean and permanent resident

Other: Singapore-registered companies that are listed in the Media Singapore Standard Industrial Classification (SSIC Code).

Destination: International

Other priorities: Applications are accepted throughout the year but to be sent at least eight weeks

before the event.

Grant coverage: Marketing Assistance provides companies and individuals up to SG\$25,000 per applicant per calendar year.

1.3 Media Development Authority

Talent Assistance

Description: *Talent Assistance* helps media professionals, both employees and freelancers, upgrade, improve their professional skills and secure work attachment opportunities. Media Development Authority (MDA) supports work attachment programmes with local or overseas media companies to help media professionals' gain hands-on training on projects for a period of 3 to 12 months. Apart from supporting studies overseas the MDA also has a programme called the *Enhanced Apprenticeship*. **Type of mobility:** Scholarships/postgraduate training courses (Under MDA's scholarship schemes); "go and see" or short-term exploration grants (work placements)

Sector: Cinema

Eligibility criteria

Nationality: Singaporean or permanent residents

Profession: Film professionals and students (for the scholarships)

Other: For the work placement, apart from freelancers, Singapore-registered companies can apply

(listed in the Media Singapore Standard Industrial Classification - SSIC Code)

Destination: International

Other priorities: Applications are accepted throughout the year for talent assistance. For the

scholarships, yearly applications are from January to March.

Grant coverage:

Work Attachment- MDA supports work attachment programmes with a local or overseas media companies to gain hands-on training on projects for a period of 3 to 12 months. Support of up to SG\$2,000 per month and up to SG\$3,000 is provided to cover return economy airfare and insurance. Training: With effect from 1 July 2012, grants that support up to 90% of the course fees, capped at SG\$15,000 annually are available. For specialised media training available only overseas, MDA can provide support towards airfare and living expenses.

Enhanced Apprenticeship: For overseas attachment, support of up to SG\$3,800 allowance per month and up to SG\$3,000 for return economy airfare and insurance is available.

1.4 Design Singapore Council

Overseas Promotion Partnership Programme (OPPP)

Description: The Overseas Promotion Partnership Programme (OPPP) aims to enhance the international recognition of Singapore's design capabilities and competitiveness, consolidating Singapore's position as a global design city. It pursues its goal by funding participation in prestigious international design platforms so that emergent Singapore-based designers and design companies can market themselves and gain access to wider business opportunities in the global arena. It is meant for designers and design companies that have been selected to participate in prestigious international design platforms.

Type of mobility Event participation grants, market development grants

Sector: Design

Eligibility criteria

Nationality: Singaporean or permanent residents

Profession: Emerging designer with good track record, emerging design companies

Destination: International

Other priorities: The platform for which the applicants express an interest must have an international

recognition. Applications to be sent two months before the event.

Grant coverage: 50% of the following participation costs, capped at SG\$25,000 (including airfare,

accommodation, booth at the international event etc.)

1.4 Design Singapore Council

Capability Development Programme (Overseas Development Grant)

Description: The *Capability Development Programme (CDP)* seeks to raise Singapore's level of design excellence and global competitiveness by providing funding support for short-term training for design students and designers. The *Overseas Development Grant* aims to enhance the international exposure, experience and networking of Singaporean design students and designers through overseas internships, attachments, workshops, school exchanges and other relevant programmes.

Type of mobility: Events participation grants (workshops); scholarships/postgraduate training courses (attachments, internships and school exchanges)

Sector: Design

Eligibility criteria

Nationality: Singaporean or permanent residents

Profession: Students and designers

Other: Pursuing a design-related course at a recognised tertiary institution or with a practicing designer, prior invitation for admission into or in the process of applying for admission into a relevant programme. Applications and supporting documents must be submitted at least two months before the

commencement of the training programme.

Destination: International

Size of grants: Each individual receives 50% of the following costs (up to max SG\$15,000 per year): official fees for the programme, airfare, accommodation and overseas subsistence allowance.

2. FOUNDATIONS

2.1 Singapore International Foundation

Singapore Internationale

Description: Singapore Internationale (SI) is the Singapore International Foundation's (SIF) arts scheme that supports the presentation of Singapore's creative works overseas. This grant is open to Singaporeans and permanent residents who present different facets of Singapore to an overseas audience through their talent and work in the arts and culture industries.

Type of mobility: Touring incentives for groups

Sectors: Performing arts, visual arts, architecture, design, art criticism, video making/new media, printmaking, sound art, literature, cross-disciplinary arts, cinema, culinary art

Eligibility criteria

Nationality: Singaporean or permanent residents

Profession: Artists, art practitioners

Other: Individuals or groups can apply for the grant. Informal groups should nominate either an individual or should be affiliated to an organisation that can take legal and financial responsibility for

grant administration. **Destination:** International

Other priorities: No support for the development of projects. The proposed work should be showcased overseas on one of the following platforms: exhibitions, performances, international festivals and events. Other platforms will be considered on a case-by-case basis.

Grant coverage: Each individual/group applicant is eligible for a grant amount of up to SG\$20,000, or typically up to 50% of the qualifying budget (whichever is the lower amount). Each individual/group applicant will be awarded a maximum of two successful grants every calendar year (January – December), according to the project dates.

3. ORGANISATIONS WITH A PARTICULAR FOCUS ON ASIA AND/OR SOUTH-EAST ASIA

3.1 Asian Cultural Council

Description: The Asian Cultural Council (ACC) supports cultural exchange in the fields of visual and performing arts between Asia, the United States and amongst Asian countries. Applications are accepted from individuals and institutions.

The main focus of the ACC grant programme is awarding grants to artists, scholars and arts specialists from Asia for study, research, observation and related activities in the United States of America or in another Asian country.

The ACC considers applications from Asian students pursuing graduate study in universities in the United States. Applications are not accepted for undergraduate programmes and the grant extends only to living expenses and international airfare. Applicants are encouraged to find other sources of funding for their tuition. Students must apply separately to universities for acceptance while applying to the ACC for funds.

Type of mobility: Residencies; scholarships/postgraduate training courses; "go and see" or short-term exploration grants; support for the participation of professionals in transnational networks; "research" grants for scholarships

Sectors: Theatre, dance, music, painting, sculpture, photography, design, arts criticism, arts theory, installation, applied arts, video/new media, architecture, cultural heritage, research, cultural management

Eligibility criteria

Nationality: Bangladesh, Brunei, Cambodia, China, India, Indonesia, Japan, Korea, Laos, Malaysia,

Mongolia, Myanmar, Pakistan, Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, U.S., and Vietnam

Profession: Artists, cultural professionals, scholars, students

Other: Individuals are the priority (even if some groups can be supported to a limited level)

Destination: United States of America and Asia

Other priorities: A limited number of grants may be awarded to institutions for projects involving international exchanges in the arts between Asia, the United States and amongst Asian countries. Grants for projects are usually very modest in size as the ACC's resources are focused on individual fellowships. The calls for applications open in the fall each year for grants starting in the springtime the following year.

3.2 Fundação Oriente

Description: The Fundação Oriente scholarships programme is one of the essential elements of the Fundação's activities in training. Its main goals are to motivate research in the social sciences and literature related to the Far East; to promote scientific exchanges between Portuguese and Oriental universities and scientific groups; to promote the knowledge of and improvement in knowledge of the languages and cultures of Portugal and the Orient; to stimulate artistic improvement; to encourage training of management staff through scholarships which will allow Oriental students who show great potential but have limited financial means to attend degree courses; to grant access to vocational intermediate training courses for Oriental students with limited financial means.

3.3 Arts Network Asia

Description: Arts Network Asia (ANA), set up by an independent group of artists, cultural workers and arts activists from Asia, is an enabling grant body working across borders in multiple disciplines that encourages and supports regional artistic collaboration as well as develops managerial and administrative skills within Asia. Arts Network Asia is motivated by the philosophy of meaningful collaboration, distinguished by mutual respect, initiated in Asia and carried out together with Asian artists and arts communities. It operates in 11 languages. ANA was created in 1999 by Ong Ken Seng (Artistic director of Theatreworks). ANA is funded through special funds from the Rockefeller Foundation and the Ford Foundation.

Type of mobility: Project and production grants

Eligibility criteria

Nationality: Bangladesh, Brunei, Cambodia, China, India, Indonesia, Japan, Korea, Laos, Malaysia,

Mongolia, Myanmar, Pakistan, Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, Vietnam

Profession: Artists, art practitioners, art activists

Destination: Asia

Other priorities: Deadline for applications is once a year. One of the objectives of the new ANA is to explore the potential of local-regional-global complementation, hence the projects related to intergenerations' local interactions, linking memories, local wisdoms and the future sustainabilities of cultures will be given priority.

Grant coverage: Maximum of US\$ 10,000 (travel grants of US\$ 1,000 are also available throughout the year). Applications to be submitted not later than one month before the event.

3.4 SEAMEO-SPAFA-Regional Centre for Archaeology and Fine Arts

Description: SEAMEO SPAFA, Regional Centre for Archaeology and Fine Arts, is part of the Southeast-Asian Ministers of Education Organization (SEAMEO), an international organization dedicated to promoting co-operation in education, science and culture in Southeast Asia. Among other aims, SEAMEO-SPAFA seeks to further professional competence in the fields of archaeology and fine arts through regional programmes and activities, and through sharing of resources and experiences.

The Centre collaborates with governments, institutions of its member-countries and associate member-countries, international agencies and academic communities, as well as non-governmental organizations and private sector bodies to carry out trainings, seminars, conferences, library and documentation services, staff exchanges etc.

Type of mobility: Events participation grants

Sectors: Painting, sculpture, photography, architecture, cultural heritage

Eligibility criteria

Nationality: ASEAN nationals

Profession: Experts, practitioners in the field of archaeology, fine arts, conservation and cultural

heritage

Destination: ASEAN countries or associate countries (rarely)

Other priorities: There is no fund as such but regular activities and programmes with possible open calls

for applications

Grant coverage: Travel grants and accommodation for some projects.

3.5 SEASREP Foundation

Southeast Asian Studies Exchange Programme

Description: The SEASREP Foundation, funded by the Japan Foundation and the Toyota Foundation, is a non-profit and non-stock organisation that aims to promote Southeast Asian studies in Southeast Asia by Southeast Asians through its projects and four grant programmes: language training; visiting professors; the Luisa Mallari Fellowships for M.A., the Ph.D. research in Southeast Asian Studies (run by the Manila office); and regional collaboration (run by the Tokyo office).

Type of mobility: Scholarships/postgraduate training courses; event participation grants

Age: Below 40 years for the Luisa Mallari Fellowship

Nationality: ASEAN member countries

Profession: For the Luisa Mallari Fellowship for M.A. /Ph.D. research in Southeast Asian Studies: Southeast Asian nationals enrolled in social science or humanities graduate programmes in a Southeast Asian university. For the regional collaboration: any scholar in the humanities or social sciences who is a Southeast Asian national residing in the region, regardless of institutional affiliation.

Destination: ASEAN Countries

Other: Fellowships aim to foster mutual understanding, and reinforce cross-national cooperation and regional identity of Southeast Asia. Applications are accepted from February to September. The fiscal year runs from 1 April to 31 March. Application forms are available from the Manila Secretariat, the Tokyo Joint Secretariat, the appropriate liaison officers of the eight participating universities, and the Japan Foundation offices in the region.

Grant coverage: N. A. Apart from the above mentioned scholarships, there are regular calls for seminars and workshops for which travel grants and accommodation can be covered.

3.6 Fukuoka Asian Art Museum

Curators-in-Residence Programme

Description: The Fukuoka Asian Art Museum (FAAM) is the only museum in the world that systematically collects and exhibits Asian modern and contemporary art. The works in the collection of the museum are not imitations of Western art or repetitions of traditional works. Instead, they seek to overcome the existing framework of art being made by artists living in 'contemporary' Asia.

FAAM invites Asian artists, researchers and curators for an extended period of time in order to present various interactive programmes. The programme aims at enriching local culture, deepening understanding and interest in Asian art among the people of Fukuoka as well as position FAAM as a major centre for exchanging ideas and aesthetics through art.

The school consists of a music school, a drama school, a film/TV/multimedia school, a dance school, a visual arts school and a Korean traditional arts school. The *Art Major Asian Scholarship Program* (AMA) is a global initiative undertaken by the K-Arts with the goal of educating students and scholars including professionals from the East and South Asian countries to help spread Asian arts around the world.

5.5 European Audiovisual Entrepreneur (EAVE)

Ties That Bind (Asia-Europe Producers)

Description: Ties That Bind – Asia-Europe Producers Workshop was organised in 2012 in partnership with Friuli Venezia Giulia Audio-visual Fund, EAVE, Udine Far East Film Festival and Busan International Film Festival/Asian Project Market, and supported by the European Union programme MEDIA Mundus. This is the fourth workshop in the series.

The programme is articulated around two workshops. The first workshop takes place at the Udine Far East Festival and second at the Busan International Film Festival. The workshop brings together 10 film producers from Asian and European countries.
