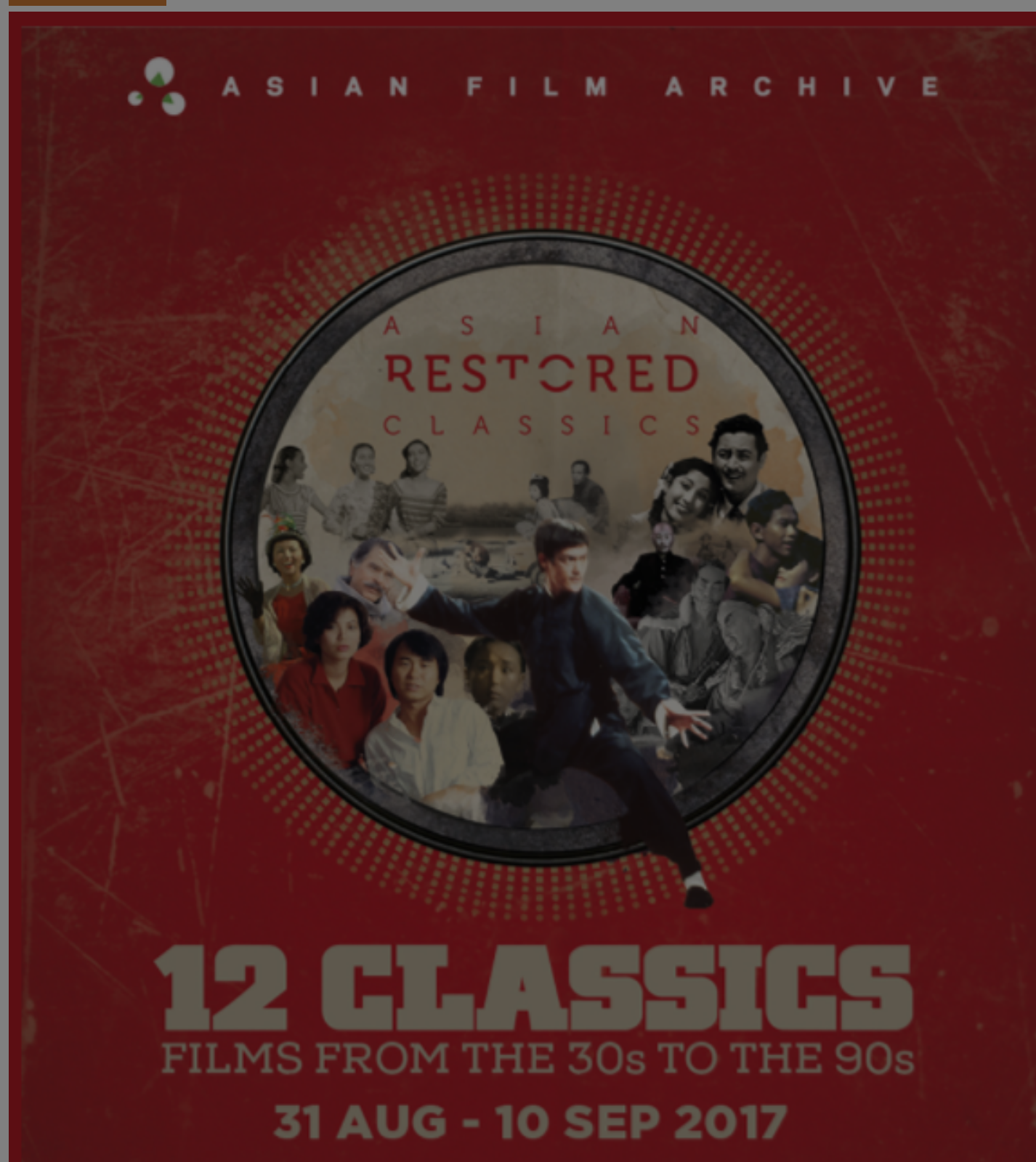

Partnership | Asian Restored Classics film festival 2017



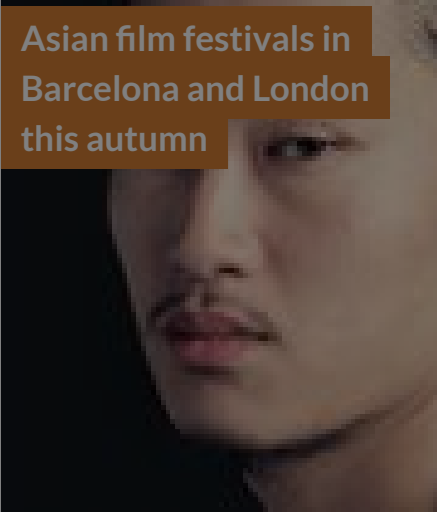
The annual Asian Restored Classics (ARC) is a festival programme presented by the Asian Film Archive in Singapore to celebrate the best of Asian cinema. It takes place in various venues in Singapore from 31 August - 10 September 2017. The festival provides a platform for the iconic films that different institutions have restored to be appreciated by generations to come. Presenting 12 timeless restored masterpieces, ARC 2017 features nine Singapore premieres and has a special Southeast Asian focus. The programme includes Japan's first colour film (*Carmen Comes Home*, 1951), one of the most soulfully romantic works in Indian
