What role for culture in foreign policy: How important is the relationship between culture and international relations? **Soft power and the role of culture in public diplomacy** can be observed in different contexts: from promoting connectivity and balanced exchanges of cultural goods and services, and arguing for the role of culture in development policies, to promoting the value of intercultural dialogue in addressing challenges around migration, and dealing with terrorism and other global instabilities.

Do artistic and cultural interests drive this agenda, or are the arts and culture being instrumentalised to achieve other goals? Moreover, is it possible to find a balance?

These questions will be discussed at the ASEF supported panel discussion on 19th October, 4:00 PM, at the <u>Zth World Summit on Art & Culture</u> in Valletta, Malta. The Summit runs from 18-21 October 2016.
