Call for artists and independent workers in the creative and cultural sectors (CCS) to respond to the International Federation of Arts Councils and Culture Agencies' (IFACCA) survey on working conditions.

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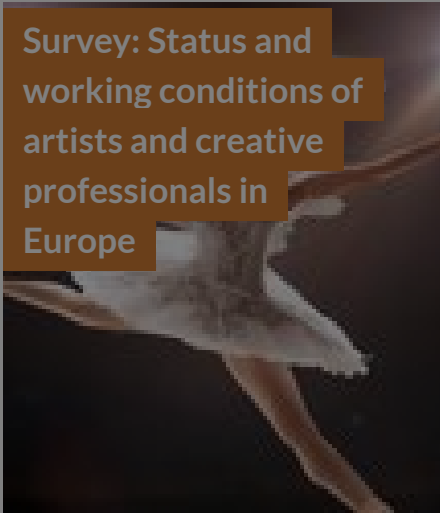
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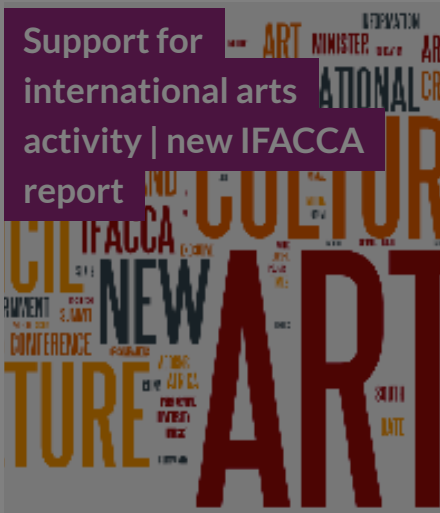
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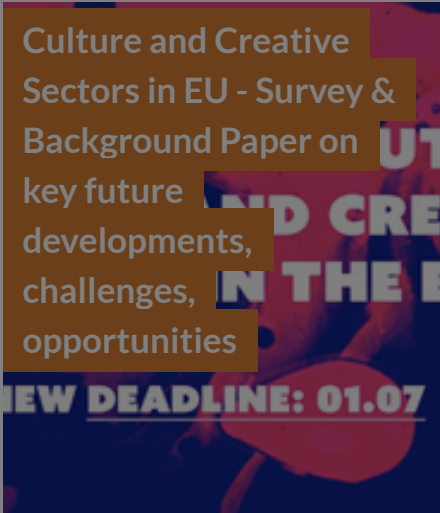
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
