

**Exhibition**" is the result of several years of excavation preformed by the Archaeology and History Department of the <u>National Museum of Korea</u>.

The Huns' tombs in Duurlig Nars and Khentii Aimag in Mongolia yielded around 100 artifacts including jade disks.

The exhibition will offer an introduction to Tomb No. 1, a gigantic tomb with a length of 54m, accompanied by attached tombs that were excavated in 2009, 2010 and 2011.
