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Program 2019



The Japan Foundation Touring Film Program returns to the UK in February 2019. It will tour to 19 cities nationwide. The program takes the theme 'People Still Call It Love', showcasing contemporary dramas to anime and classics looking at Passion, Affection and Destruction in Japanese Cinema. It is the largest of its kind focusing on Japanese cinema in the UK.

The tour will take place from 2nd February to 28th March 2019 and it will arrive at the ICA in London from 2nd to 10th February 2019. Featuring thoughtfully selected films from Japan's artistic repertoire, the films all focus on and explore the theme of 'love'.

The Japan Foundation Touring Film Program 2019 will show case 18 Japanese films, most of which have never been screened in the UK. This year's event will include 4 films from female directors.
