Staged for 4 weeks from 14 February - 16 March 2014, the Adelaide Fringe is an open access festival in which over 4,000 artists literally take over the city.

Adelaide Fringe Director Greg Clarke said that the beauty of being an open access festival is that musicians, performers, comedians and artists at all stages of their careers can take part in the Adelaide Fringe.

Mr Clarke said, "Adelaide audiences love seeing new work by upcoming artists and for many artists it's where their careers often start.

"Adelaide Fringe provides a platform for artists to try out new work, develop and hone skills and network with like minded people in the arts industry. It is also great fun and exciting to be a part of."

To participate all artists have to do is register their event on the Adelaide Fringe website by 9 October


