NZ curators tour programme supports three emerging/mid-career curators for visits to Seoul, Shanghai and Beijing October 1-24.

China and Korea are both at the cutting edge of the global contemporary art scene.

After a successful inaugural year, the partnership between <u>Creative New Zealand</u> and <u>Asia:NZ</u> has been renewed to support three emerging to mid-career curators to visit Korea and China between 1-24 October 2011, with an optional add-on to the Yokohama Triennale in Japan.

The curators will visit centres in China and Korea, including Seoul, Shanghai and Beijing. Asia:NZ will arrange formal programmes in each city in collaboration with contracted arts experts. The programme will include meetings, ground transport and translation services, and the participating curators will have the opportunity to discuss the itinerary prior to the tour.
