

It is widely admired by its peers throughout the world for the range and relevance of its exhibitions, for its innovative use of its growing Collection, for its award-winning education and community programme and for its visitor-centred ethos and facilities.

It achieves this through a dynamic and changing programme of exhibitions and education programmes based in its home at the Royal Hospital Kilmainham and working with partners nationally and internationally. IMMA is the home of the **national collection of modern and contemporary art** and takes responsibility for the care and maintenance of this national resource. IMMA ensures that it is accessible to visitors and beyond through exhibitions, collaborations, loans, touring partnerships and digital programmes.
